Artist Statement

As an artist, I welcome inspiration from the natural world around me. From my rural home, or while out exploring, I appreciate everyday beauty me and seek a way to personally translate it into a work of art.

Oil is my primary medium, although I also like to work in acrylic, encaustic, handmade paper, and mixed media. I paint intuitively, finding myself increasingly drawn to a more abstract, emotional way of working. I begin with a general idea and go where it leads me.

Artist Statement

Painting is a visual language. It is communication that connects people on an intimate level. This is my goal as I begin my work. I consider myself a water media artist. Using watercolor, gouache, acrylic, collage and pencil, I allow spontaneous compositions to develop by combining technique and the natural qualities of the chosen medium. I draw my inspiration from nature; the organic details and texture of life.

Sometimes I begin my paintings with abandon; other times I begin with a specific idea or goal, setting a new challenge for myself. I use colors and textures to build a subsurface. Then I carefully assess what is before me and begin to calm, subtract, or neutralize. As the painting progresses, it takes on a life of its own as I continue to manipulate it. My process involves balancing light and dark, cool and warm, large and small shapes.

My intention is for the viewer to discover something new in themselves, feel an emotion or walk a new path.

While raising a family, I worked on several mediums: Stained glass, pottery, watercolors, gouache, and acrylics. I worked in an architectural firm doing graphic design and ink renderings. Later, I co-owned a freelance design company, creating designs to be manufactured by several giftware companies. I have been treasurer for Northstar Watermedia Society for seven years, and I am a member of Phipps Center for the Arts, the White Bear Center for the Arts, ArtReach, and Hasting Area Arts Council.
