Marianne is a self-described expressive, and impressionist painter working in her home studio in Stillwater, Minnesota. She grew up moving around the country with her family and spending seven of those years on the Gulf Coast of Mississippi, where she was fortunate to study painting with Dalton Shourds King. It was those early mentorships, not a formal education that formed the basis for the artist she would become. Currently, Marianne moves between oils, acrylics and mixed media, each providing effects and techniques to bring a desired outcome.

I studied with talented professional painters in my youth, and as a person who never went to art school, those experiences provided me with a foundation that I still use.
