Hansen called meeting to order at 5:30 PM.

Glidden asked how best to share ideas that she's received from others for programming, materials, and services. Troendle responded that the best way is to send suggestions to splinfo@stillwatermn.gov to be routed to the appropriate staff person.

Troendle reported on Library Legislative Day on February 25. There are four legislative priorities: 1) support and bonding for public library construction and renovation grants; 2) support for equitable terms and pricing for public and school library eBooks; 3) raise awareness of Minitex and work of academic libraries; and 4) support efforts to authorize local government to prohibit or restrict possession of weapons in public facilities, including public libraries. AGENDA ITEM 5: RFP for Professional Services

Quijano reviewed the RFP for Professional Services as outlined on the cover sheet and included in the board packet. The purpose is to select a qualified firm to prepare a Children's Library & Event Wing Enhancement Plan (CLEWE Plan). Quijano asked for questions and feedback on the RFP.

Hansen noted that the funding for the planning stage is provided by the Foundation, and that we have the support of our community partner on this. This is a planning step to get information before making decisions about going further.

Glidden asked about recruiting firms to apply. Troendle will place the RFP notice on the League of Minnesota Cities' site, on the library's website, and will directly contact firms that this library and other libraries have worked with in the past.

Troendle asked if the timeline and request for three references felt sufficient. Troendle noted that the timeline for responding to the RFP should be fine for the vendors. The timeline may be tight for the library to evaluate responses, depending on the number of responses and the quality received. The timeframe for the library to make a decision could be adjusted, if needed.

Motion to approve the Request for Proposals for professional planning and design consultant services for the Children's Library & Event Wing Enhancement Plan and authorize staff to issue the RFP as presented. These numbers are not final as year-end financial entries are pending, including interest earnings, unrealized gains/losses, operating general insurance, and plant general insurance. Entries typically occur in the spring in conjunction with the audit. Until then, we will not know the library’s official year-end total.</p> <p>Fund 120 – Capital Outlay The capital budget for 2025 is \$102,000. \$61,763.25 expended.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Masonry (\$50,000): \$50,000 was budgeted for the completion of the multi-year masonry project. \$46,200 was expended, funded by city capital outlay. The masonry project is completed. • Wi-Fi Access Replacement (\$12,000): \$12,000 was originally budgeted for printer replacement in 2025. IT shifted the project to 2026 and instead updated Wi-Fi access points. \$5,224 was expended, funded by city capital outlay. • ADA Enhancements (\$20,000): \$20,000 in supplemental funding was allocated for ADA enhancements to address potential findings of an accessibility study of city facilities. Study results are pending. Initial improvements would include additional seating and new planters. \$6,266.47 has been expended to date. The updated revenue and expenditure for 2025 is \$21,274.63. • Interest Earnings and Unrealized Gains/Losses (\$0): TBD revenue/loss. Finance will enter earnings, gains, and losses from the market in the spring of 2026 as part of the audit. • Library Generated Revenues (\$12,620): This reflects library meeting room fees, card fees for out-of-state residents, lost/damaged fees, printer/copier fees, and gallery income. \$11,677.10 received. 	

Expenditures

The library's total city expenditures for 2025 were budgeted at \$1,689,044. The library's full operational funding request was adopted by the City during the budget process, but some small city adjustments were made to specific line items, resulting in budgeted expenses of \$1,173 over projected revenues.

Operating Expenditures

Operating Personnel: The operating personnel budget is \$1,210,086 (excluding the in-kind Volunteer Coordinator). 2025 expenditures total \$1,160,249.56, for a savings of \$49,836. These savings are due, in part, to staffing changes early in the year with the retirement of Lori Houston and Cindy Selnes. In addition, open shelving shifts have also contributed to savings.

Collection: The library budgeted \$60,100 in city funds for the purchase of print, audio, video, and electronic materials for circulation. \$60,816.90 was expended in 2025.

Technology: The library budgeted \$67,100 for technology-related expenditures. \$56,121.79 was expended, for a savings of \$10,979. Part of the savings is due to a change in the payment of the library's annual Windows license bill. Instead of being paid out 2025 funds, the bill was prorated to align to city guidance, with \$4,333 charged to FY 2025 and \$8,867 charged to FY 2026.

Other: The library budgeted \$32,436 for other operating expenses. \$30,836.58 expended to date.

- Pending entry for general insurance to be made by Finance in Spring of 2026. Last year, these charges were about \$4,000.

Plant Expenditures

Plant Personnel: The plant personnel budget is \$139,781. \$136,510.90 expended for 2025, a savings of \$3,270.

Plant Supplies & Equipment: The plant supplies budget is \$6,500. \$9,094.02 expended to date, an overage of \$2,594.

Plant Services and Charges: The plant services and charges budget is \$155,873. \$127,482.95 expended to date. We are projecting to end the year at about \$175K, or about \$19K over budget.

- **Plant Insurance (\$46,970):** Expense will be entered by Finance in Spring of 2026.
- **Energy (\$80,000):** \$68,926.26 expended. Electricity was about \$6,400 under budget, and gas was about \$4,700 under budget.
- **Building Repairs & Maintenance Agreements (\$23,000):** \$52,592.77 expended. Significant expenditures were incurred for unexpected repairs to the elevator nearest 4th Street and for a new HVAC compressor and other HVAC repairs.
- **Other (\$3,203):** \$4,738.28 expended.

Year-end Projection & Fund Balance

With final numbers needed for insurance, interest earnings, and unrealized gains and losses, an exact year-end number is unknown. If insurance comes in as budgeted, then we estimate ending the year about \$37,000 under budget, plus or minus gains or losses in investments. The final overage or underage would automatically be applied to the library's fund balance, as this is a self-balancing account.

Supplemental Funds

Beyond the library's city budget, about \$390,000 in supplemental funding from the Foundation, Friends, Lawson, and other donors was budgeted to cover operating and capital needs, such as 100% of programming, just over 50% of materials, all the Sunday hours, the 20-hr youth librarian, newspaper digitization, and more. A supplemental fund report is attached.

Unrealized gains/losses need updating by Finance on all supplement accounts.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

This Memorandum of Agreement (“MOA”) is entered into between the Stillwater Public Library Board of Trustees (hereafter “Library”), the American Federation of State, County, and Municipal Employees (Local No. 517) (hereafter “Union”), and Erin Look.

WHEREAS, the Library and the Union are parties to a collective bargaining agreement (“CBA”) in effect January 1, 2026 until December 31, 2028; and

WHEREAS, on December 5, 2025, the Library Foundation approved a three-year commitment to fund a 20-hour per week Youth Services Librarian I position with grant money; and

WHEREAS, due to the current three-year commitment for grant funding, the Youth Services Librarian I position is currently a temporary, limited-term position; and

WHEREAS, the Library and Union intend the Youth Services Librarian I position to be excluded from certain provisions under the collective bargaining agreement including those in Article 17 including Sections 17.4, 17.5 and 17.6 and Article 18.

NOW THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

1. Erin Look, employed in the Youth Services Librarian I position, is excluded from certain provisions under the collective bargaining agreement including those in Article 17 including Sections 17.4, 17.5 and 17.6 and Article 18 and shall not have seniority, bumping or recall rights as it relates to layoff.
2. Erin Look, employed in the Youth Services Librarian I position, will not be given any seniority preference as outlined in Article 18 of the collective bargaining agreement.
3. This MOA shall remain in effect through December 31, 2028, concurrent with the current CBA. If grant funding for the Youth Services Librarian I position is extended beyond December 31, 2028, this MOA shall continue in effect for the duration of such funding, and the position shall remain temporary and limited-term unless otherwise agreed to in writing by the parties.
4. This MOA represents the full and complete agreement between the parties regarding this matter.

Report from Library Director, Mark Troendle

Major Accomplishments

- The RFP for professional planning and design consultant services was finalized and made available publicly on February 13. Ten site tours have been scheduled. One addendum has been issued, with a second currently in preparation.
- Library staff participated in annual safety training coordinated by HR. Topics included general safety, emergency action plan, employee right to know, bloodborne/infectious disease control, fire extinguishers, and ergonomics.
- An order for the majority of new terrace furniture was placed.
- The parking ramp entrance gate was repaired after being out of service for nearly a month.
- Four Library Corner articles were written and published in February, and the February issue of ShelfLife was published on February 4.

Heads-Up

- The library will be closed on Sunday, April 5.
- The loan period for circulating magazines (excluding current issues) has been extended from one week to three weeks, giving patrons additional time to read and enjoy past issues from the Library's collection of more than 120 magazine titles. The change also aligns with a recent update at Washington County Library.
- The Stillwater Public Library Foundation's current Administrative Coordinator, Annette Look, will resign her role effective April 3. The position has been renamed Development and Communications Coordinator, and the Foundation is currently accepting applications. The priority deadline is March 27, though the position will remain open until filled. The role supports the Foundation's fundraising, communications, and event work.
- Stillwater Township recently notified past funding recipients, including the Library, that it will discontinue general donations unless a formal service agreement is in place. The Library has acknowledged the notice, thanked the Township for its past support, and shared that we value the many Township residents who use the Library. We also expressed openness to future conversations about a possible service agreement.

Near-Term Future Focus

- The Business & Communications Manager continues to collaborate with staff as she prepares the Minnesota Public Library Annual Report. Keri is also preparing a joint impact report between the Library and the Foundation. This first-ever initiative will align the Foundation's impact reporting with the Library's strategic plan progress report in one unified document, reflecting our shared commitment to transparent communication about our collective impact.
- The PLA (Public Library Association) Conference will be held in Minneapolis on April 1–3, and a number of staff will be able to attend thanks to donor support.
- Mark is assisting the Library Foundation with a grant request of their own.
- The Library Foundation is engaging in a strategic planning process. The Strategic Approach Team (SAT) will consist of two members from Propel Nonprofits, four Library Foundation Board members, and the Library Director. Preliminary work has already begun with a board self-assessment survey.

February Programs and Activities

Art & Music

- **Porcelain Pot in Acrylic with Karen Chan:** 18 attended this class on Saturday, February 7. This program is funded by the [Minnesota Arts and Cultural Heritage Fund](#), also known as Legacy Funding. Participant comments:

We were able to assist him with navigating his folders, syncing his documents to OneDrive, and making new directories and albums to for his photos."

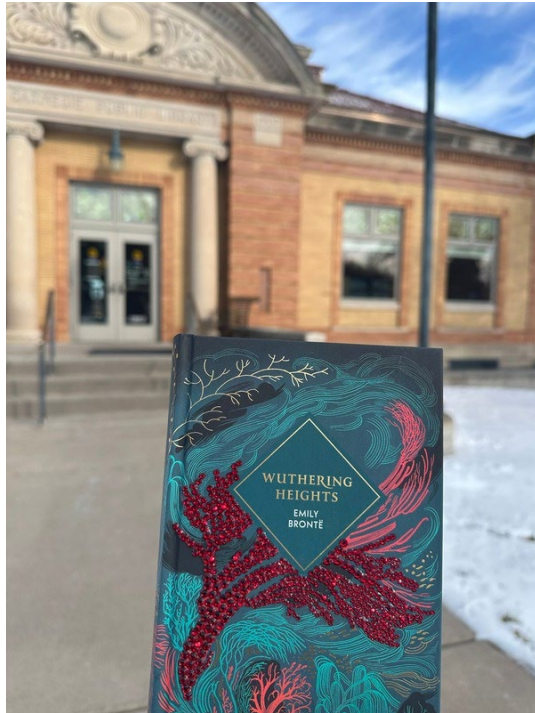

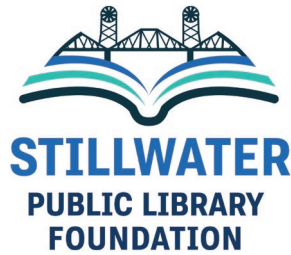

 - a. We've exceeded our budget for contributions income and we're on track for expenses. Other income also exceeded budget because investment returns have been better than expected.

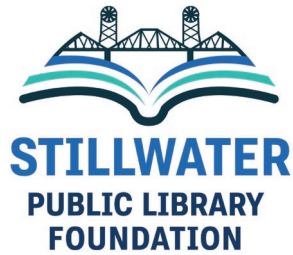
c. Bookkeeping Recommendation

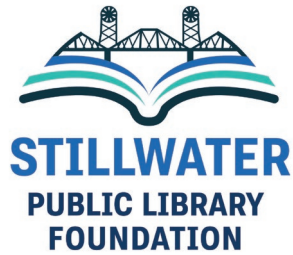
